2. Major activities and achievements

Bharati College, this year has introduced 'Earn While You Learn', after many brain storming sessions with the staff, a modified replacement of direct fee waiver under Self Help Cell. Under the direct Fee Waiver scheme the students who could not afford college education were granted full fee waiver including annual fees. This has been entirely a voluntary effort and run solely on donations from the teaching and non-teaching staff of the college. The scheme of 'Earn While You Learn' also supports students in need of finances but with grace. It offers three options to students to pay their fee,

- i) pay fee in two installments,
- ii) pay fee in three installments, or
- iii) earn fee through self-help cell.

A number of areas are identified where the college and its staff could absorb some extra help like accounts department, administration department, medical room, computer lab, library, event organization, EOQ cell, etc. Through this learn and earn scheme students got the opportunity to earn their fee while acquiring professional skills, like filing, book keeping (in accounts), filling vouchers, handling and managing books, maintaining disciplines, becoming the writers and reader for differently abled students, doing data entry etc. This was to make the students empowered and inculcate the values along with the sense of independence. This scheme was also introduced with the objective of making the students understand the system of educational organization and get a sense of pride, and acquire some very useful skills through training which will stand them in very good stead when they are ready for the job market.

In the academic year 2014-15 around 40 students were part of learn and earn and 30 students took benefit of installment scheme to pay their fee.

Another new and important feather in Bharati College Cap is the Commerce Nexus. This initiative has been taken to make the continuous learning process possible and assist

students who may not be able to physically attend classes not to lose touch with the curriculum. The web based 'Student Notice Board' is used to upload assignments and important notes for students. Links like 'Fun Page' and 'Book Bank' are popular sites. Since projects are an important part of today's curriculum, project work, paper writing, workshops and talks form an important part of their learning process.

The counselling cell of Bharati College have helped 5 students, 3 faculty members and 2 non-teaching staff members this year by a trained Psychodynamic Counsellor. The techniques of free association, transference and interpretation are followed with an attitude of unconditional acceptance to develop a trusting relationship. The basic aim is to help the individuals to unravel, experience and understand their true, deep-rooted feelings in order to resolve them.

The counselling cell has also assisted in giving legal aids to students whenever required.

Year 2014-15 has seen a lot of changes. The Swachh Bharat Abhiyan was launched at Bharati College by the Principal, Dr. (Mrs.) Promodini Varma and an enthusiastic bunch of students and the whole staff of teaching and non-teaching took oath on 25th September 2014 in the presence of Mr. Pawan Mehta, Under Secretary, Department of Higher Education, MHRD. A day prior to the launch, a massive awareness drive was undertaken through posters, social networking sites and word of mouth in the college. The students were divided into groups and they personally cleaned every nook and corner of the college. Special attention went into ensuring cleanliness of areas like the canteen, library, toilets and the college lawns which are the favourite haunts of students and therefore, more prone to littering. On October 2, the cleanliness drive was taken to the District Centre, Janakpuri, New Delhi where students cleaned the premises and presented street plays and songs on the importance of cleanliness.

Bharati College also organized special march past by students of NCC/NSS around Janak Puri on Rashtriya Ekta Diwas on 31st October, 2014.

Bharati College has also introduced online payment of fees for 2nd and 3rd year students.

4. Research Projects

Innovation project BW 20, Title: Familial violence faced by college going young women through the lenses of Bharati College students.

The main objective of the project was to explore the invisible violence concealed in the seams of family and kinship relationship which saddles young women with triple burden of patriarchichal burden, household responsibilities and continuous mounting pressure from the growing market economy. The findings of the project were quite as predicted before or hypothesized. Girls from our college face a lot of violence from their family members.

Project on "Family counselling and legal aid services" is supported by Central Social Welfare Board, Ministry of Women and Child Welfare.

It has been a great pleasure for Bharati College to be a part of Gyanodaya—V trip. Bharati College selected Sikkim for their project named 'Sikkim as a Total Organic State'. The aim of the project was to explore Sikkim and its policy of being an environment friendly state and to provide its people pesticide and chemical free produce. It has been really a great experience for the students to go for field survey in 'Martam Village' in Gangtok. Lall Bazaar and local market were visited to find organic products and to record data for the project. All have worked hard to make the project best and purposeful. It was a great learning experience for all of us.

6. Library Development

The College has a large and well-equipped library with the latest text books, reference

books and journals in various subjects and disciplines. It also has books, journals and

magazines of common interest in order to encourage general reading and broaden the

intellectual horizon of students. The library currently has 48,500 books. The library

subscribes to a number of academic journals and periodicals of varied interest to

encourage the reading habit of the users. The library also subscribes to 17 Newspapers in

English and Hindi. The Library reading room has a seating capacity of 100 students.

Library also has a collection of Braille scripts for visually challenged students. This year

760 books and 42 journals/periodicals were added.

To promote research activities among faculty members the Library has institutional

membership of N List. The cost of journals includes Rs. 5,000/- as annual subscription of

e-resources through the N-List Programme. In the year 2014-15 three CCTV camera have

been installed in the Library. Issue period of books has been reduced for members of the

staff so that books are available for circulation among students. Outdated books have

been weeded out. The library of Bharati College is one of its kind and fully digitized where

students and faculty members can use their OMV cards to get books issued.

 The college is actively involved with numerous extension and outreach programmes. The students and the faculty both make an active contribution towards these programs in our college The College has special committees for NSS, NCC, Sports, Eco Club, Women's Development Cell etc. wherein the members meet and plan their activities for the entire year.

Details of camps organized by College are:

- Cleanliness Drive: A cleanliness drive was carried out in the College during September, 2014 in which 25 students volunteered to clean the premises of the College. In the camp each student worked for 2 hours for 7 days.
- Camp for Creating Awareness against Tobacco: An awareness drive was carried out in the College during October, 2014 in which 25 students volunteered to create awareness against the consumption of tobacco and to make Delhi tobacco free. In the camp each student worked for 3 hours for 5 days.
- **KOPAL:** Kopal is a society comprising the teachers and students of Bharati College who work for the underprivileged sections of society, generating awareness and arranging sensitization programme. It also puts up nukkad nataks against social evils like child labour, gender discrimination and the importance of education. For the past one year we have been working with the children of migrant labourers, who work on construction sites. We worked with them at site of Dili Haat, Janak Puri and now we are working with the

same children whose families have shifted to the construction site at Bharati College. We provide non-formal education to them, teach them about values, hygiene and cleanliness and hold get together and provide meals to them.

The college has been undertaking various practices which have contributed to the quality improvement of the core activities of the college. Some of the best practices are:

I. Extended Orientation Program: Bridging the Gap between School and College (EOP)

- The objective is to make students aware of the choices that are available to them and how to negotiate with the changing and complex social situations that they are faced with.
- In EOP, we show students films/articles dealing with topical and burning issues and hold discussions around them.
- The college tries to create a friendly democratic space through EOP where a free flowing dialogue between teachers and the new students who have just taken admission in the college can talk openly about issues that affect their daily lives.
- The impact of the programme has been very positive. Students bond with the institution and teachers faster and make friends across subjects and sections; teachers spot talent and potential leaders early.

II. Extensive Use of Technology

- Use of technology has been a part and parcel of our teaching pedagogy for the past few years.
- Class—rooms are technologically well-equipped with overhead projectors and laptops.

- The college has three well–furnished and well equipped computer laboratories for the students to enable them to enrich their learning with ICT.
- Students and Teachers also interact beyond classrooms through technology. Students prepare their projects and assignments with ICT and teachers evaluate the projects and assignments and solve students' problems online.
- Students are also using technology in their co-curricular activities like photography, CD mixing, etc.
- The college also has video recording facilities for students who wish to make projects and short documentaries on social issues.
- The students also interact with teachers and co fellows on WhatsApp groups formed by students and teachers.

III. Innovative Methods of Teaching

- Case-studies, real-life examples, movie analyses, pictorial graphs etc. have now made classes more interesting and engaging.
- The Department of Political Science brings out a broadsheet each term purely on student initiative though under the guidance of a faculty member.
- Department of Hindi, Sanskrit and English use theatre as a means of education by encouraging students to translate, dramatise and then act out challenging and relevant texts.

IV. Providing Equal Opportunities/Facilities to Students with Different Ability

- College has installed mobility devices and constructed special pathways for persons with special needs.
- Every floor has user-friendly washrooms and Braille signage..
- College has a dedicated Equal Opportunity Cell for such students which facilitates students from the reserved categories, minorities, the north-east, and anyone else in need of special assistance..
- The Cell has a separate room where students have special computers and special study material for their use.
- Regular coaching sessions are held for students willing to improve their communication skills/employability skills.
- Awareness raising sessions are also conducted on a regular basis.
