In 1943, by a Delhi University Act, Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board was established, where in women students were enabled to take some of the examination of the University with special coaching but without attending regular classes. This gave shape to the Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board (NCWEB).

The Board began functioning in September, 1944 with 3 students. At present, the enrolment is more than 24,000. Only women students residing in the National capital Territory of Delhi can enrol themselves as students of the Board. NCWEB is a unique system with lectures on Sunday and academic breaks leaving students with six working days to follow their dream. In this neo-age of 100% cut-offs, class room crunch, gender discrimination, NCWEB is a welcome arrangement and a most satisfactory way to attain a degree from University of Delhi.

ABOUT BHARATI COLLEGE

‘Bharati’, meaning speech, reflects another name of Goddess Saraswati, an authority on academics, arts and knowledge. Bharati College, a premier and prestigious college for women, was established as a constituent college with permanent affiliation to the University of Delhi by Delhi Administration on 20th September 1971 as Bharati Mahila College. Bharati College, one of the top women's college in West Delhi, is a constituent college of the University of Delhi is located in a serene and scenic campus and caters to about approx. 3500 students, offering instruction in eleven disciplines in the Arts, Commerce and Social Sciences. 

She emphasized Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman's first budget for Amrit Kaal, which focuses on macroeconomic stability, women's empowerment, and sustainable development. Dr. Singh emphasized the critical role of investments in education and youth empowerment in realizing India's demographic dividend. Dr. Singh also emphasized India's use of technology and innovation in healthcare, agriculture, and other sectors to drive progress, stating that Amrit Kaal provides a meticulously planned roadmap for India's future prosperity, contingent on collective efforts from all segments of society.





Fresher's Party

Fresher's Party was organized on 11th Feb, 2024. The event was hosted by student volunteers, which began with Saraswati Vandana, praying to the Goddess to remove the darkness of ignorance from their lives. The students were welcomed by the TIC- Dr. Luke Khanna. She spoke about the need for empowering women, about being good citizens. She also encouraged the students to take up opportunities that came their way in the form of competitions and other co-curricular activities. Dr. Khanna was followed by Dy. Coordinator Dr. Madhuri Sharma, who focused on all round development as the main goal. She suggested that the students should be able to take decisions with confidence, to challenge and raise voice against bad practices and tradition. Dr. Sharma emphasized on the fact that students must thoroughly engage in curricular and co-curricular activities. She concluded by encouraging students to have fun while working hard. Students not only gave dancing and singing performances but also swayed the audience by playing instruments like the guitar. There were several individual and group performances depicting their confidence in not only entertaining the audience but also showcased their abilities. The highlight of the Fresher's party was the competition for Ms. Fresher's. Students were elegantly dressed for the same and took part in the ramp walk and talent show.





Self-Defense Training Program

A self-defense training camp was organized on 3rd March, 2024 in collaboration with UDANKAAR NGO in Bharati college premises. This training session was planned under the guidance of TIC Dr. Looke Khanna and Deputy Coordinator Dr. Madhuri Sharma with the objective of equipping students with skills of self-defense. Miss Preeti (Judo National player) was the trainer. Around 300-350 students participated enthusiastically. Students were taught several defense mechanisms which could be used by them in difficult situations. They were also taught how by learning the basics of self-defense skills you prepare yourself for dangerous and unforeseen circumstances in addition to various other benefits such as discipline, respect, self-control, improving coordination, balance, speed, strengths, flexibility as well as overall health, wellness, and a positive way of life. The overall experience of students was very positive. Several other faculties were present along with volunteers.





Seminar on Indian Knowledge System

Bharati College, NCWEB centre, in collaboration with the Delhi Sanskrit Academy organised a seminar on 9th March, 2024 on the Indian Knowledge System. Several eminent speakers graced the event by their presence. Prof. Ramesh Bhardwaj was the keynote speaker. He spoke about the integration of Indian knowledge traditions into the national education curriculum. Prof. Bhardwaj discussed about the reflection of Indian knowledge system in the New Education Policy (NEP), 2020. He emphasised on the fact that India has had a rich heritage and history. He highlighted how the education policy included by Macaulay destroyed the Indian education system and the traditions and practices associated with it. Prof. Bhardwaj very eloquently talked about emotional integrity, which implies not judging anyone by their class, caste, religion as we all are Indians and part of a larger family, and therefore should not indulge in any kind of discriminatory practices. Prof. Shivshankar Mishra, who was the distinguished speaker for the day spoke on the speciality of Indian philosophy from the perspective of the Indian knowledge system. Prof. Mishra and Dr. Devkrishna Das, another prominent speaker for the day, emphasised greatly on the prominence of the Vedic traditions. They explained how the four Vedas namely, the Rigveda, Samveda, Yajurveda and Atharvaveda along with six Vedanga and eighteen Puranas and several Upanishads contain enormous knowledge not only about different subjects but also about leading a proper way of life. Prof. Dayal Singh Pawar, who was the Chief Guest for the day also discussed about the Indian knowledge system at great length. He discussed about the different skills that people can engage in, which is also part of the NEP curriculum in schools, colleges and institutions of higher education. Prof. Pawar emphasised on 'Moksha' (salvation) being the main purpose of the Indian knowledge, to attain 'Brahma' (being one with the Supreme power).





Annual Sports Day

On 10th March, 2024, Sports day was organized in Bharati college under the supervision of Teacher In Charge Dr. Looke Khanna and Dy. Coordinator Dr. Madhuri Sharma. Around 200-250 students participated enthusiastically in several games organized by sports committee. Throughout the event, students participated in a diverse range of competitions that included 100 m. race followed by various other events such as 200 m race, three- legged race, skipping, lemon spoon race and musical chair that showcased our students’ exceptional speed and agility. NSD's "Poorvator Natak Samaroh"


On the 27th and 28th of March 2024, NSD in collaboration with NCWEB, Bharati College, staged their annual "Poorvator Natak Samaroh, 2024" at the Bharati College Auditorium. On Day-1, the event began with an ambience dance performance of the Manipuri "Khamba-Thoibi" dance by the students of NSD. It was followed by a lamp-lighting inaugural ceremony and speech given by the NSD Registrar Pradeep K Mohanty, NCWEB Director Prof. Geeta Bhatt and the Principal of Bharati College Prof. Saloni Gupta. The inaugural was shortly followed by the play titled Unchayi by the renowned Assamese playwright, actor and director Baharul Islam and his troupe "The Seagull Theatre". The play was about a misanthropic man who resolves to follow the path of "Herostratus" and make history by evils deeds and in this case by killing random people in the streets. It is originally based on the story "Erostratus" written by Jean Paul Sartre.

On Day-2, the play titled Saral Barta by playwright and director Partha Pratim Acharya and his "Natyabhumi Theatre Group" from Tripura was staged at the Bharati College auditorium. The play was in Bangla and it was inspired by a short satirical play by the renowned Hindi Satirist Harishankar Parsai. The play showcased an interesting format of "alienation" from the Brechtian theatre and talked about the plight of a poor man called Saral who in spite of being an honest man lands in hell and he tries to prove his innocence till Yamraj appears and gives him a solution.



Student's Engagement and Critical Thinking

The NCWEB students, under the guidance of their teachers at Bharati College have engaged in various activities involving learning. The "Fountain Model of Democracy" is a metaphor that describes democracy as a continuous flow of participation and engagement from the people, where citizens are actively involved in the decision-making process. It suggests that democracy should not be seen as a stagnant pool where citizens merely cast their votes periodically, but rather as a dynamic process where ideas and feedback continuously circulate, much like water flowing from a fountain. They also delve into critical topics such as the significance of voting, the first-past-the-post method, and the role of the state in shaping democratic processes. It highlighted the importance of voter participation in ensuring representative governance. Students explored various factors influencing voter turnout, including socio-economic disparities, political awareness campaigns, and institutional reforms aimed at enhancing electoral integrity.



Quiz and Essay Writing Competition

Field Visit to Charkha Museum, Gandhi Smriti & Rajghat

A field visit to Charkha Museum, Gandhi Smriti & Rajghat was organized on 11th May, 2024 for the students as part of the Value-Added Course on Gandhi and Education. The team included 40 students and 5 Faculty members. The purpose of the visit was to introduce students more thoroughly to Gandhian values and principles. The first place visited was Charkha Museum located at Connaught Place, New Delhi where various types of Charkhas and its evolution over the years were shown to students highlighting the Gandhian emphasis on self-reliance and vocational training. Students were then taken to Gandhi Smriti where students learnt about Mahatma Gandhi, his journey from Mohan to Mahatma. Students were shown a small documentary revolving around the last 144 days of Mahatma Gandhi's life that he spent at Birla House. Gandhi Museum at Gandhi Smriti was extremely fascinating for the students. The use of technology to spread Gandhi's message of Unity, untouchability, respect for all religions made learning very engaging and captivating for the students. The Museum provided comprehensive insight into Gandhi's life, philosophy, and his role in India's struggle for independence. Lastly, students visited Rajghat to pay their homage to the Mahatma. The visit was very moving for the students. On the whole, the visit to all the three places associated with Mahatma Gandhi enlightened the students both educationally and spiritually.



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

A major advantage of the non-collegiate programme of teaching is its low cost and utilization of the existing infrastructure of educational institutions during Saturdays/Sundays and academic breaks. The Board gives financial aid and book loan facility for the academic year to the needy and deserving students. The NCWEB plays a pivotal role in empowering women by providing them with access to higher education, fostering personal growth, and facilitating economic independence. Here's how NCWEB serves as a catalyst for women's empowerment: **Accessible Education:** NCWEB offers women the opportunity to pursue undergraduate and postgraduate studies through distance learning mode, allowing them to balance their academic pursuits with personal and professional responsibilities.

By removing barriers to education, NCWEB enables women from diverse backgrounds to access quality higher education without the constraints of attending regular college. **Flexibility and Convenience:** The flexible nature of NCWEB's programs empowers women to tailor their academic journey according to their individual needs and circumstances. With the option to attend weekend classes, access online resources, and engage in self-paced learning, women can overcome logistical challenges and pursue education at their own pace, regardless of their location or commitments.



The Reflection of Gandhian Way in National Education Policy 2020



God has poured knowledge into each being, and education helps reveal its perfection, which is already within an individual. Education aims not merely to create cognitive individuals, but rather holistic development with critical 21st-century skills. The fundamental principles of National Education Policy 2020 recognise the unique capabilities of each student, multidisciplinary

and holistic education, promoting multilingualism and the power of language, ethics, a rootedness and pride in India, also for its great scholars such as Charaka, Susruta, Bhaskaracharya, Brahmagupta, Aryabhata, Varahamihira, Chanakya, Chakrapani Datta, Madhava, Panini, Patanjali, Nagarjuna, Gautama, Pingala, Sankardev, Maitreyi, Gargi and Thiruvalluvar, etc.

The emphasis on 'higher-order' cognitive capacities is depicted going back to Gandhi's Nai Talim, which was proposed in his newspaper Harijan and emerged at the Wardha Educational Conference in 1937. The Idea of free and compulsory education, Mother Tongue should be the medium, focus on Productive work, etc, is re-emerging in NEP 2020.

First, by ensuring universal access to education at all levels, the goal is to achieve a 100% gross enrollment ratio from preschool to secondary level by 2030 depicted Gandian vision.

Second, the focus on Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) apparently considers over 85% of a child's cumulative brain development occurs prior to the age of 6, reminding Gandhi's vision that education must be skill-based and could provide employment which initiate at the childhood level.

Third, the stress of learning in the mother tongue and the availability of books in the mother tongue or home language is a turning point in the Indian education system, which clearly depicts the execution of Gandhian ways of learning and education. The NEP 2020 concentrates on investing in language teachers in all regional languages around the country, particularly for all languages mentioned in the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India.

Fourth, the teacher, as the epitome of education, again emphasises the roots of Gandhi, that we require a path to reach ultimate knowledge, and that path is enlightened by a teacher. A standard-setting body under the Ministry of Education, PARAKH (Performance Assessment, Review, and Analysis of Knowledge for Holistic Development), is visioned to achieve the ultimate goal of holistic development.

Fifth, Vocational skills development (with a view towards obtaining local employment) and critical life skills (including financial literacy, digital literacy, commercial skills, health care and awareness, child care and education, and family welfare) will be developed by a new and well-supported constituent body of the NCERT is apparently stated in NEP 2020.

The Idea of the Samagra Shiksha, Inclusion, Affordability, Mother tongue, Quality education for all, Vocational skills, and critical life skills to prepare holistically developed students first and teacher ahead is the foundation of NEP 2020, where Gandhian Talim is renaissance-ing today to be a Vishwaguru.





These green corridors not only beautify the urban environment but also provide essential habitats for wildlife, creating interconnected networks that allow species to thrive amidst human activity. But the benefits of such measures extend far beyond biodiversity conservation.

Green infrastructure in cities helps to mitigate the impacts of climate change by lowering the urban heat island effect, improving air quality, and absorbing carbon dioxide. Moreover, green spaces enhance the well-being of city dwellers, providing opportunities for recreation, relaxation, and connection with nature. To make this vision a reality, it is essential to have collaboration between city planners, architects, environmentalists, and local communities. Municipalities can encourage green building practices, implement policies that prioritize



biodiversity conservation, and invest in green infrastructure projects. Meanwhile, community-driven initiatives such as urban gardening, community forests, and citizen science programs can actively engage residents in the preservation and enhancement of urban biodiversity. By reimagining our cities as living, breathing ecosystems, we have the opportunity to create more resilient, sustainable, and inclusive urban environments. Together, let's pave the way for a future where cities are not just centers of human activity but thriving hubs of biodiversity and ecological balance.

Meaningful youth participation in DEMOCRACY



Participation in the democratic life of any community is about more than voting or standing for election, although these are important elements. Young people are motivated and interested in political issues in our societies, however they find that traditional avenues for participation are not delivering on their promise. Youth civil society has been particularly affected by the shrinking civic space, and yet has been delivering support in times of crisis, such as during the COVID-19 pandemic and to refugees fleeing the war in Ukraine. Discrimination of all kinds, along with a general othering and infantilization of youth, keeps


adding barriers to youth engagement with democratic processes and institutions, creating an atmosphere of mistrust and disenfranchisement. Youth participation in the member states is changing and evolving together with young people and society. The Council of Europe and the member states should invest in research and dialogue among young people, youth civil society, youth researchers and policy makers. On-traditional ways of youth participation ought to be recognized and supported as legitimate acts of democratic engagement of young people and be given due consideration in research about youth participation.

Youth-friendly information and quality formal and non-formal education about democratic participation and decision-making structures and processes at local, national and international levels should be available to all young people. Public authorities at all levels should provide transparent, accurate and accessible information to young people and youth civil society, allowing them to participate in the development and monitoring of the implementation of measures in the youth field. Easily accessible, sustainable and meaningful structural funding should be made available to independent youth organizations, including national youth councils, as important platforms of socialization and of the exercise of democratic participation. Youth-led experimentations in youth participation, such as forms of deliberative democracy (e.g. randomized youth assemblies) should be promoted as complementing representative democracy and structures for youth participation such as youth councils. Discriminatory barriers to the equal access of all young people to



participation opportunities must be recognized and removed in order for them to take part in decision-making processes free of repercussions, retaliation or judgment. Independently managed schemes to provide legal and financial support to young activists who face repercussions (including trials, harassment, injury, exile, etc.) for their involvement in democracy should be created. Young people must be encouraged and supported to stand for office including, for example, through the introduction of youth quotas for electoral lists; particular attention must be given to young people from minorities.

Young people in rural areas deserve equal opportunities when accessing information and education, as well as to participate; youth centers, including mobile ones, should be created to provide youth work and non-formal education as well as information in these areas. Independent student councils must exist in every school so that young people have the power to concretely influence decisions in their schools and local communities; young people should be involved in the definition of the curricula and content of the topics studied in



schools so they respond to their needs and interests. All democratic processes must ensure that minority voices are heard in society and minorities are part of the decision-making process; structures dedicated to youth should include not only those elected by a majority, but also give voice to the wide diversity of young people. Mental health services must be provided and made easily accessible to young people, be youth-friendly and tailored to respond to the needs of minority youth. Young people need to have access to quality youth work and non-formal education, regardless of where they are; member states should ensure quality education for all young people, emphasizing the particular and urgent attention to rural and minority youth. This implies investment in the infrastructure required for youth work and the training of youth workers. Youth workers must be provided with education and networking spaces to reach out to and empower minority youth, including outreach measures; non-formal educational materials on meaningful democratic youth participation and on addressing discrimination and inequality should be made more widely available.
