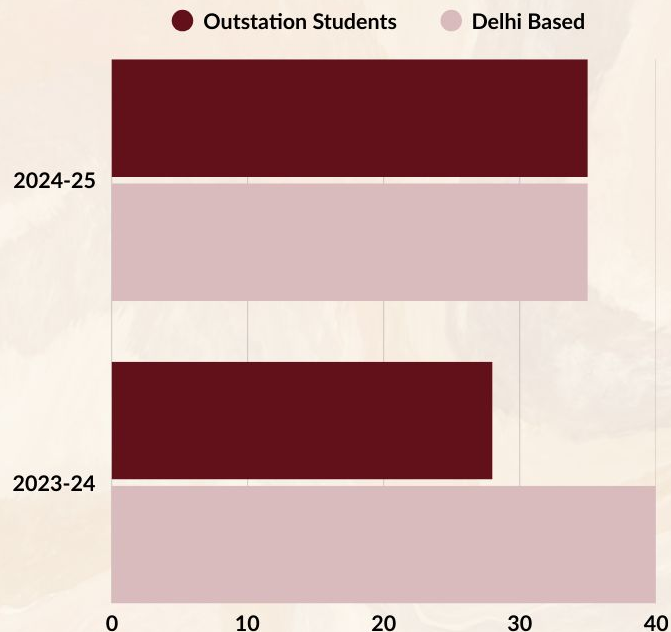

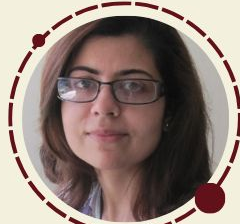

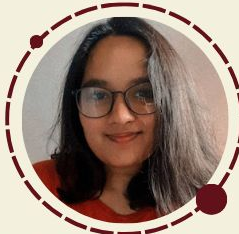

2024-25	15	209	13.93
2023-24	15	217	14.46

The number of faculty remained constant at 15 in both years. However, the total number of students declined from 217 in 2023-24 to 209 in 2024-25. Consequently, the student-to-faculty ratio improved from 14.46 to 13.93. This indicates a slightly more favorable academic environment in 2024-25, allowing for potentially increased individual attention and improved teaching outcomes.

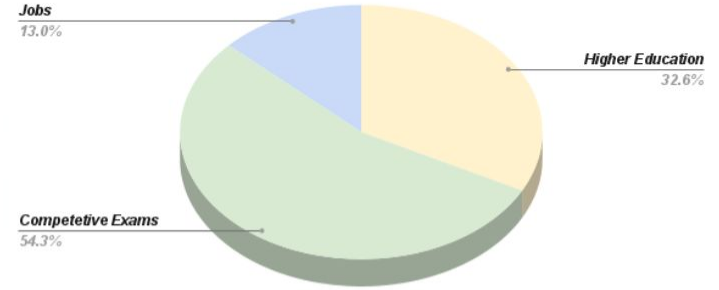


STUDENT PROGRESSION TO HIGHER STUDIES

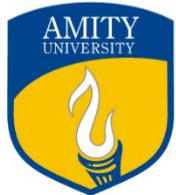
STUDENT PROGRESSION CHART
